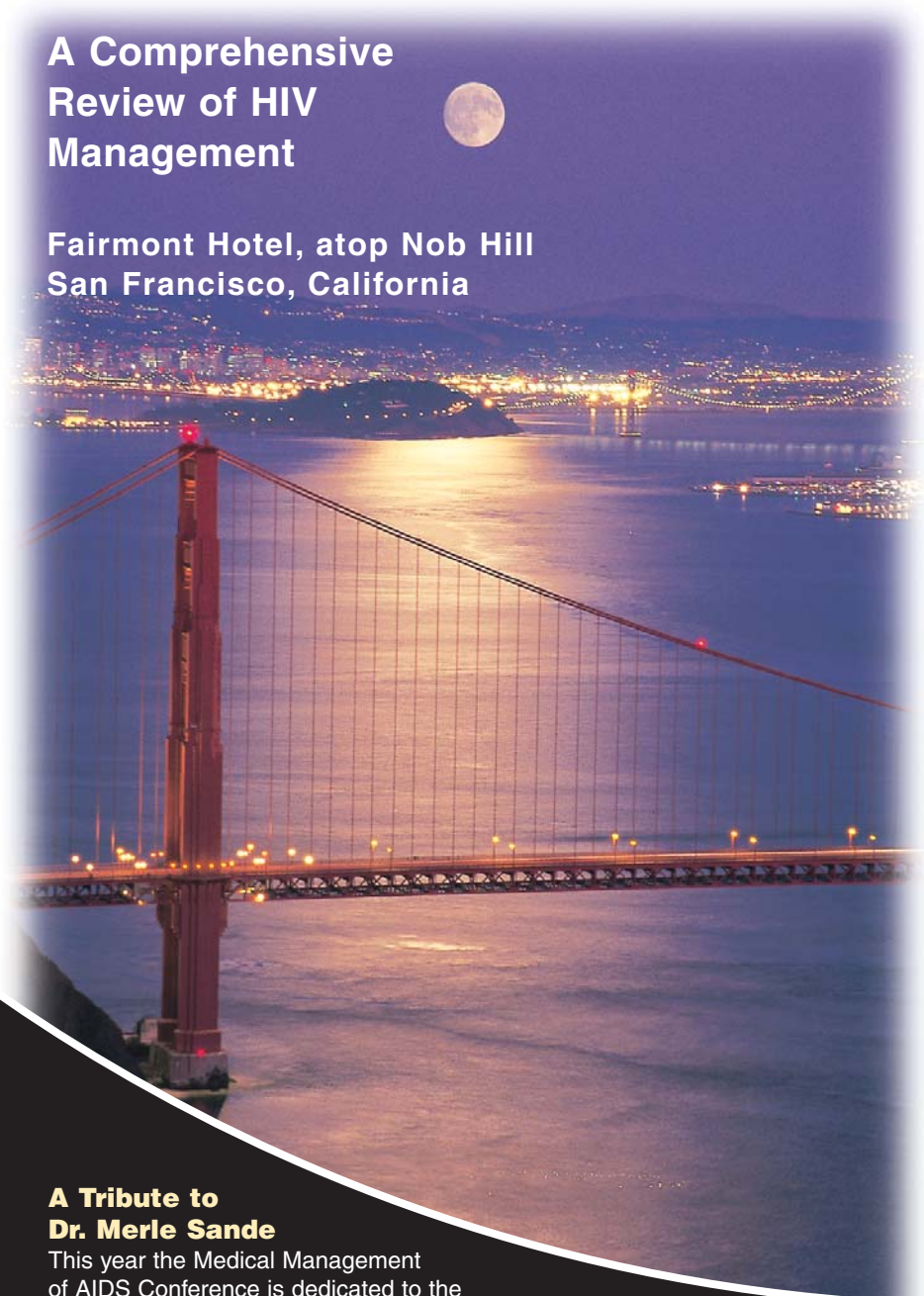

A Comprehensive Review of HIV Management

The medical care of HIV/AIDS patients continues to become more complex. Optimum clinical care depends on understanding more sophisticated concepts of pathogenesis and laboratory monitoring. To keep pace, we invite you to join a distinguished faculty for a comprehensive review of HIV management December 7 - 9, 2006, in San Francisco, California.

This course provides the active clinician with at least an intermediate level of HIV knowledge with a comprehensive review of the science and application of HIV therapy. Lectures are presented by a group of leading clinicians and researchers who are also dedicated to teaching in their area of expertise. Topics addressed include current dilemmas in antiretroviral therapy, the nature of the immune response to HIV therapy, complimentary medicine, common metabolic and drug toxicities, as well as HIV/HCV/HBV co-infection. In addition, attention is devoted to the unique management challenges that accompany caring for women including during pregnancy. This course is designed to familiarize attendees with the latest concepts in HIV science and medicine. Ample time for discussion is included.

In recognizing the many challenges arising from the improvements of HIV therapy, the lunch hour on Thursday and Friday will be dedicated to focused small group sessions on relevant topics.

Now in its 18th year, this symposium is well-designed for practicing clinicians including internists, family practitioners, infectious disease specialists, nurse practitioners and physician's assistants.

This symposium is presented by the Division of AIDS – Positive Health Program, San Francisco General Hospital, Department of Medicine, University of California, San Francisco, School of Medicine.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to describe

- Recent changes in the epidemiology of AIDS, nationally and globally;
- New developments in the understanding of HIV pathogenesis;
- Important side effects of medications used in the treatment of HIV and relevant drug interactions, including metabolic toxicities from HIV infection and antiretroviral therapy and rational approaches to treatment;
- Antiretroviral resistance and current strategies for salvage therapy;
- Current recommendations for vertical transmission, women and AIDS, and HCV and HBV/HIV co-infection;
- New developments in HIV-related dermatologic, pulmonary, and HIV related pain management and end-of-life care.
