Obstetrics and Gynecology Update: What Does The Evidence Tell Us?

New information on obstetric and gynecologic practice is being produced at a rapid rate. Leaders in the field, including those at the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, are taking an evidence-based approach when formulating practice guidelines. Review of the agendas and speakers lists of CME courses given across the country reveals that many courses do not place an adequate emphasis on reviewing currently available data with conference participants. This course will provide such an emphasis.

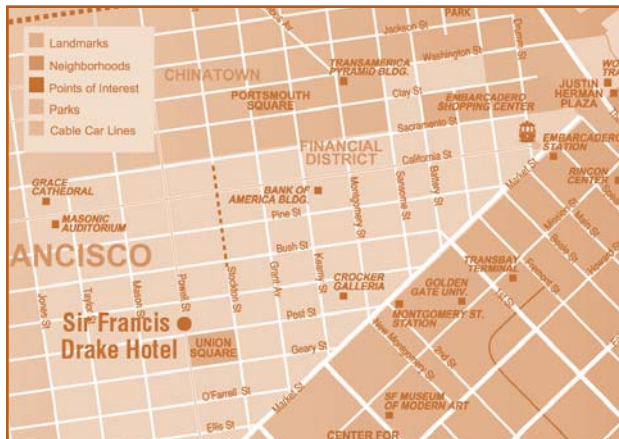
