This annual conference is designed as a three-day course, with morning and evening sessions on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. This year's sessions will include a review new advances in the treatment, early detection and prevention of breast, genitourinary, gynecologic, head and neck, sarcoma, and lung cancers. It will also include a session on translational science related to hematologic cancers. The program is focused on clinical management and issues facing the busy practicing community internist, oncologist, radiation oncologist, and surgeon. Each session will have one invited guest faculty, two UCSF Faculty, and two case presentations by community physicians, highlighting diagnostic and treatment dilemmas faced in daily practice. Full CME credit is being offered through the University of California, San Francisco.

- Identify emerging therapies available to patients with breast, genitourinary, gynecologic, head and neck, sarcoma and lung cancers.

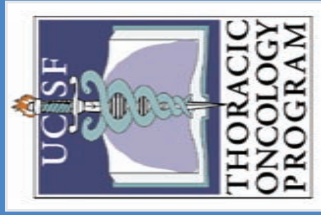
