ESSENTIALS OF WOMEN'S HEALTH: AN INTEGRATED APPROACH TO PRIMARY CARE AND OFFICE GYNECOLOGY

July 4-9, 2010

Increasing appreciation of the unique needs of women patients and women's health care providers has created a need for innovative educational programs on women's health. This program, designed for family physicians, internists, gynecologists, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists, and all others involved in providing quality health care for women, will provide a practical update on a full range of common but controversial issues in women's health. The course will serve to enhance the skills of those already working in women's health as well as help develop new skills for those expanding their work to include more primary care and office gynecology.

Developed and taught by UCSF faculty in both Primary Care Internal Medicine and Obstetrics and Gynecology, the course will present an integrated approach to women's health. Emphasis will be placed on new developments in preventive care and cardiovascular risk factors in women, issues in reproductive health, and clinical strategies in the diagnosis and treatment of common gynecologic complaints and common medical problems of women. Special emphasis will be placed on office skills needed for modern day practice including: enhanced skills in physical examination, office gynecology, sports medicine, and patient communication. The course will use interactive lectures, clinical vignettes, hands-on workshops, small group discussions, an audience response system, questions and answers, and a detailed syllabus.

This course is presented by the Division of General Internal Medicine, Department of Medicine, and the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Sciences and is sponsored by the Office of Continuing Medical Education, University of California, San Francisco.

The purpose of this course is to increase competence and improve clinician practice in women's health. We specifically anticipate improvements in skills and strategies to:

- EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES**
- Discuss and implement new guidelines in office-based preventive medicine for prevention and early detection of cancer with clinical exam, pap tests, genetic testing, diagnostic imaging;
 - Select patients for optimum use of the HPV, influenza, and other recommended vaccines;
 - Discuss and implement new guidelines for prevention and treatment of cardiovascular risk factors in women;
 - Diagnosis and treat common problems in women's health including osteoporosis, breast cancer, obesity, diabetes, menopause, overactive bladder, incontinence, fibroids, ectopic pregnancy, abnormal bleeding, sexually transmitted infections, and atrial fibrillation;
 - Assist in shared decision-making in contraception and therapeutic abortion;
 - Diagnosis and treat common musculoskeletal complaints;
 - Care for older patients presenting with dementia and to support their families;
 - Communicate with patients and the legal system to prevent malpractice.

ESSENTIALS OF PRIMARY CARE: A CORE CURRICULUM FOR ADULT AMBULATORY PRACTICE

August 8-13, 2010

Changing patterns of medical practice are placing greater responsibility on primary care physicians. Increasingly difficult management decisions must now be made in the ambulatory setting. Moreover, primary care physicians must be increasingly competent in office skills and procedures more commonly associated with specialist practice. At the same time, many specialty-trained physicians – particularly obstetrician gynecologists, traditionally-trained internists and medical subspecialists – are being asked to play an expanding role in primary care practice. Nurse practitioners and physician assistants are also playing an ever-increasing role. This course is designed to provide a comprehensive “core curriculum” in adult primary care. The course will serve as an excellent update and review for current primary care physicians and other primary care professionals, and as an opportunity for specialists to expand their primary care knowledge and skills. Particular emphasis will be placed on principles of primary care; office-based preventive medicine; practical management of the most common problems seen in primary care practice; and expanded skills in clinical examination and common office procedures. Special emphasis will be placed on skills in dermatology, gynecology and women’s health, neurology, nutrition, and interpretation of ECGs and diagnostic tests. The course will utilize formal lectures, hands-on workshops, case discussions, an audience response system, and questions and answers. A detailed syllabus will be provided for all participants.

This course is presented by the Division of General Internal Medicine, Department of Medicine and is sponsored by the Office of Continuing Medical Education, University of California, San Francisco School of Medicine.

The purpose of this course is to increase competence and improve clinician practice in primary care. We specifically anticipate improvements in skills and strategies to:

- EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES**
- Discuss and implement new strategies to: guidelines in office-based preventive medicine including cancer screening, management of cardiac risk factors, prevention of cerebrovascular disease, use of vaccines, and prevention of sexually transmitted infections;
 - Manage common problems in women’s health including abnormal pap tests, hormone therapy, menopause, vaginitis, sexually transmitted infections, contraception, and office procedures;
 - Develop strategies to care for common office problems including diabetes, hypertension, lipid disorders, stroke, delirium, dementia, epilepsy, congestive heart failure, and chronic kidney disease;
 - Diagnose and treat common skin disorders and skin cancer;
 - Counsel patients to lose weight and increase physical activity;
 - Perform an effective problem-focused history and physical examination for evaluation and treatment of dermatologic, gynecologic, and neurological symptoms;
 - Perform common office procedures in dermatology and gynecology;
 - Order and interpret standard and new diagnostic tests;
 - Interpret electrocardiograms.
