# Rapidly Progressive Dementia and Subacute Encephalopathies: Diagnosis and Management

The University of California, San Francisco, Department of Neurology invites you to join a faculty of some of the leading experts in rapidly progressive dementia (RPD) for a one-day conference at the Marriott Union Square in San Francisco.

Diagnosis of RPDs present a challenge even for experienced neurologists, and there are few established principles to guide general neurologists and primary care physicians. Although Jakob-Creutzfeldt disease (CJD) is the most notorious form of RPD, several other conditions can mimic CJD, many of which are potentially treatable. Furthermore, even the diagnosis of CJD can be difficult and delayed.

This course will introduce participants to the latest cutting-edge diagnostic techniques and provide a diagnostic algorithm for RPD. Neurologists, neurology residents, geriatricians, internists, family practitioners, and psychiatrists can benefit from this program, which will see them better equipped to identify and manage such cases.

- Develop a diagnostic algorithm for assessment of patients with a rapidly progressive dementia
  - Explain the more common etiologies of rapidly progressive dementias
  - Identify the most sensitive and specific methods for diagnosing CJD

  - Explain the strengths and limitations of cerebrospinal fluid testing
  - Predict, identify and treat cognitive dysfunction associated with anesthesia and with medical illnesses
