The 2011 Symposium continues the tradition of encouraging interaction between the participants and speakers. This year presentations will review the current approaches to a range of vascular diseases including endovascular treatment of abdominal and thoracic aortic aneurysms, innovations in dialysis access, and occlusive arterial lesions affecting the lower limbs. Sessions on cerebrovascular disease, venous thromboembolic disease and vascular medicine will address current standards of practice and areas of controversy. A "Technical Tips and Tricks" video session has been added to the program and there will be a Pan Pacific view of primary aortic and cerebrovascular diseases, provided by speakers from China and Japan. Finally, we are extremely pleased to include Dr. Anton Sidaway, past-President of the Society for Vascular Surgery, who will give this year's Binkley Lecture.

In summary the 2011 UCSF Vascular Symposium will provide an outstanding opportunity for the vascular specialist to remain current in this rapidly evolving field.

GREEN MEETING

This is a "green" meeting. The syllabus will be available online one week prior to the course.

The purpose of the Symposium is to address practice gaps and improve clinical practices in the area of vascular disease. We will focus on providing information to improve strategies:

- to achieve limb salvage by lower extremity revascularization coordinated with diabetic foot ulcer care;
- to identify the pros and cons of endovascular aneurysm repair for both abdominal and thoracic aneurysms;
- to compare approaches and devices for aortic aneurysm repair by both North American and Asian practitioners;
- to develop a treatment algorithm for various venous pathologies;
- to incorporate current recommendations for the treatment of cerebrovascular disease based on the recent clinical trials and consider the most recent data on patient selection for treatment of asymptomatic carotid stenosis;
- to prescribe a successful regimen for the non-operative treatment of peripheral vascular disease;
- to develop an optimal approach to the creation and maintenance of arterio-venous fistulas for hemodialysis.
